Victims Services....Safety and Empowerment

Passaic County Women's Center

192 women and children were sheltered: 4496 calls received on the 24-hour hotline: 396 victims received legal advocacy, counseling and other supports in the community; 76 child witnesses of violence and their 41 caregivers received case management and creative arts therapy; 99 victims of domestic violence had support at the police station during a crisis; 1156 citizens were educated on domestic violence and sexual assault; 156 survivors of sexual assault received support; 43 at police/hospital during crisis; 186 families and their DCP&P workers were educated about domestic violence

Camden County Women's Center

228 women and children sheltered; 5986 calls received on the 24-hour hotline 1707 victims received legal advocacy, counseling and other supports in the community; 90 child witnesses of violence and their 65 caregivers received case management and creative arts therapy; 3554 citizens were educated on domestic violence; 321 victims of domestic violence had support at the police station during a crisis: 663 families and their DCP&P workers were educated about domestic violence


